Parent/Guardian Consent Form

Mentoring Youth for Leadership is a program provided by Justice For All and is available to middle and high school students. Mentoring is proven to greatly benefit the academic, social and emotional well being of children and can provide a source of motivation, encouragement and inspiration for both the mentee and the mentor.

All mentors involved in the program are thoroughly screened and must complete a background check for your child’s safety. Mentors receive training to lay the foundation for a successful mentoring relationship as well as clarify roles, boundaries, expectations, and safety issues.

Justice For All staff and mentors are required to report any minor (under 18 years of age), who is currently endangered by abuse or neglect, and to report if children are suspected of being a danger to themselves or others.

Justice For All is not responsible for any accident or loss of property incurred during the mentoring relationship. Justice For All, its staff and mentors are released of any fault or liability of any kind or nature incurred during the mentoring relationship.

In permitting your child to participate in the Mentoring Youth for Leadership program, you understand that Justice For All is authorized to release or exchange any relevant information with its partners for reporting purposes alone.

Justice For All requests permission for your youth to participate in Mentoring Youth for Leadership. Participation is completely voluntary.
