

Transitional House Update





Justice for All has had transitional housing as part of the ministry for two years. There have been two tenants who have moved into and out of the green transition house. Recently JFA was able to purchase a second house in Rock Valley to be used for transitional housing. The blue transition house is in the process of being cleaned out and updated to provide a potential individual or family with the ability to have a safe place with support in the program to get things situated in their life. Through the transistional housing program, JFA is committed to working with individuals and families to develop the potential God has given them.

Kentucky Bus Trip

From April 11 to April 17, we traveled with forty-eight others on the JFA Kentucky Bus Tour. It was a week of learning, spiritual renewal, encouragement, and inspiration that demonstrated JFA's mission statement – "Providing opportunities, building relationships, and redistributing resources through caring and sharing in Christ's name." Over the week we stopped at partner missions and other places of interest to understand the culture of the area. Partner ministries included Appalachian Mission of Hope, Grace Covenant Ministries, Helping Hands Thrift Store, and Appalachia Reach Out.

Another stop included a tour of an old coal mine. Mining coal was the largest employer in Eastern Kentucky; *US Steel* closed the mines because importing coal was cheaper. The closures have left Eastern Kentucky impoverished. We were informed that many people in the hollars have no vehicles and are decimated because of no jobs.

The tour also included Fort Boonesborough on the Kentucky River, and a Bluegrass Country Tour of a racehorse farm. Then we visited the ARK Encounter. The full-size scale of Noah's ark was over 510 feet long and seven stories high. It was very impressive.

On the trip home to Rock Valley, we stopped in Dubuque. The bus rides were full of visiting with new and old friends, telling jokes, playing trivia, singing, and sharing how God has worked in our lives. It was so enjoyable to be able to spend time with others who have a passion for JFA.


JFA and Aid for Ukraine

In God's economy, faith is the investment that conducts the will of God. Part of *JFA*'s mission is to redistribute resources through caring and sharing in Christ's name. *JFA* strives to live out that mission locally, nationally and across the world. Siebrings continue to organize and facilitate containers. The fourth shipment should arrive in the Ukraine before December 1.



In 2023 JFA has loaded three more containers for aid to Ukraine. People have come from miles to assist in filling the containers. In Ukraine, the war rages and its residence suffer even more from having less. Regardless of our political leanings and opinions about this unjust war, the plight of millions is visible through human suffering. Ukrainians are displaced, hungry, cold, and traumatized through that which they have no control.

Being able to give and extend a helping hand shines the light of God in this dark place. Partnering with *Hope Haven Sunflower Seeds Ukraine, Orphan Grain Train* and others, the many donations provided are allowing Gordie Siebring to distribute goods all over Ukraine.
